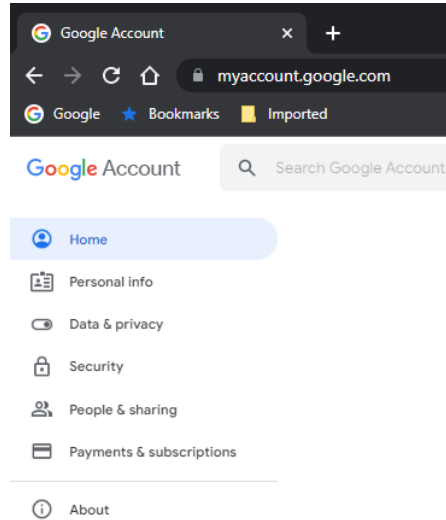
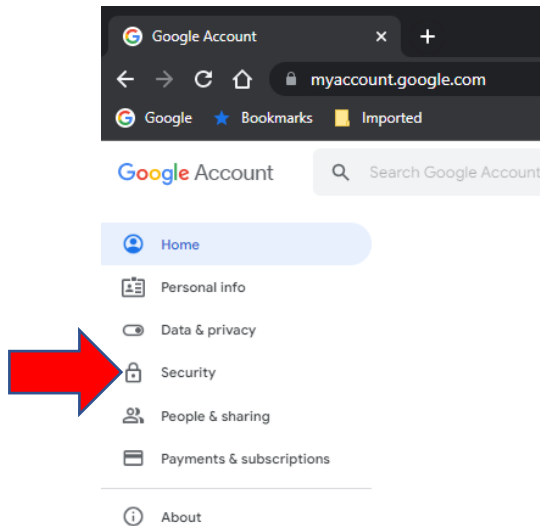


Google 2FA Setup

1. Open Google web browser and login to your district assigned Google account. Once logged in go to <https://myaccount.google.com>.



2. Select Security option from the column on the left.



3. Select 2-Step Verification option at the bottom of the screen.

It is highly recommended Google Authenticator application is also configured as a secondary/backup option. The Google Authenticator app works anywhere and does not require a Wi-Fi or cellular connection.

To configure Google Authenticator, install the Google Authenticator mobile application from your cellular phone app store. Once installed, select Authenticator App option below.

Backup codes

These printable one-time passcodes allow you to sign in when away from your phone, like when you're traveling.



Google prompts

To receive Google prompts, just sign in to your Google Account on your phone.

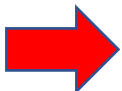
After you enter your password on a new device, Google will send a prompt to every phone where you're signed in. Tap any one of them to confirm.

You're not currently signed in on any devices that support prompts.



Authenticator app

Use the Authenticator app to get free verification codes, even when your phone is offline. Available for Android and iPhone.

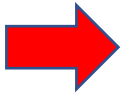


10. Select Set Up Authenticator.

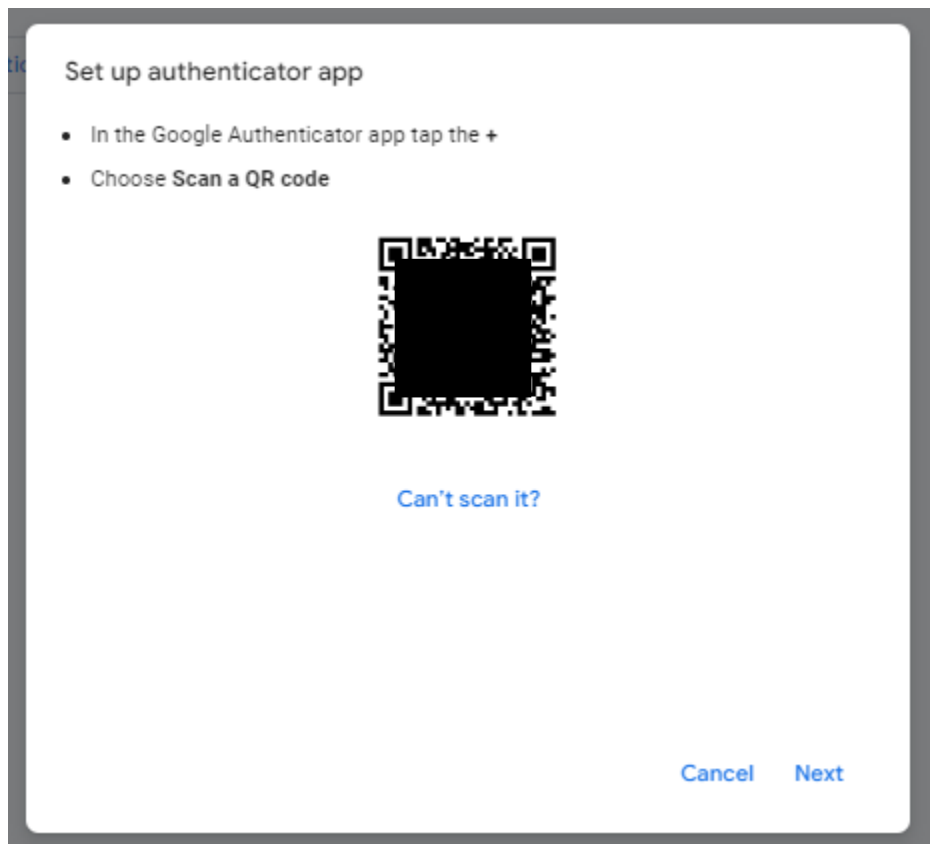
Instead of waiting for text messages, get free verification codes from an authenticator app. It works even if your phone is offline.

First, download Google Authenticator from the [Google Play Store](#) or the [iOS App Store](#).

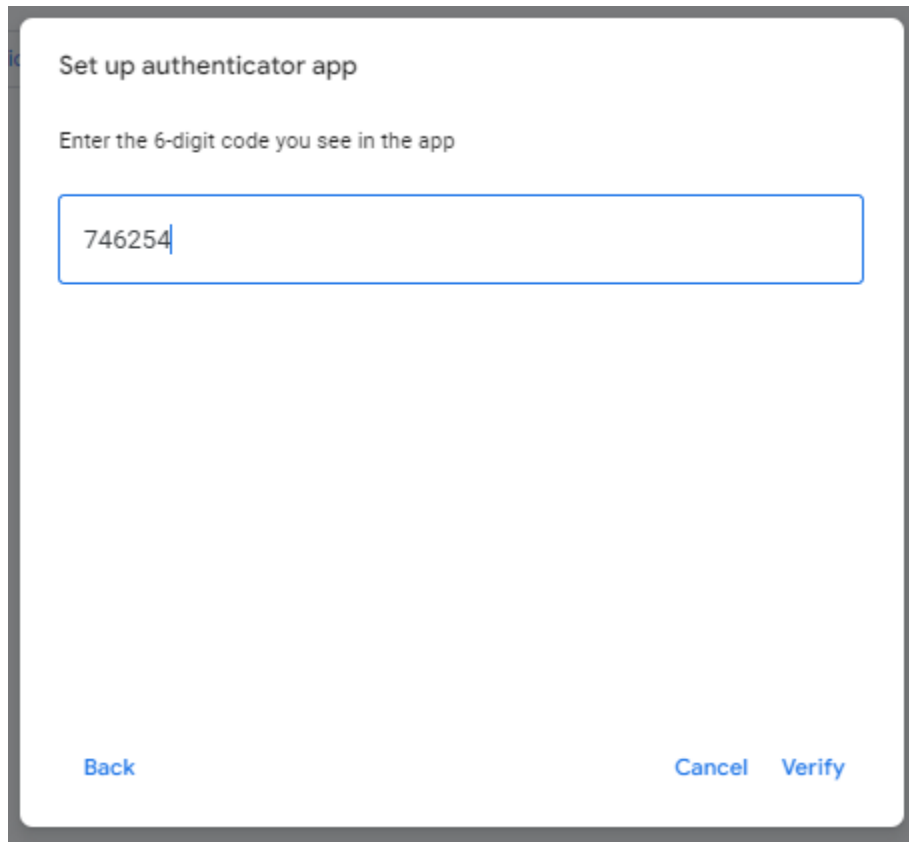

11. Open the Google Authenticator application on your phone and select the “+” button in the lower right corner of the screen. Select Scan A QR Code then scan the code on the screen from the Google 2FA enrollment app. (Note: QR code below is for information and not to be scanned).



12. After the QR is scanned it will automatically create an account within Google authenticator linked to your district Google login name. Locate the code and enter it below. Note: Google Authenticator app codes reset every 30 seconds.

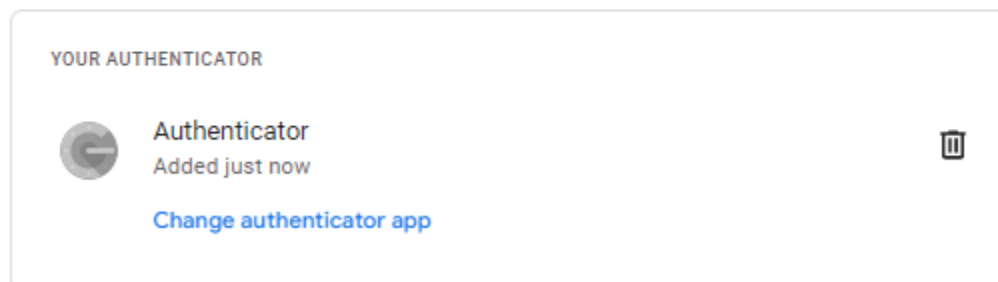


13. Confirmation screen.

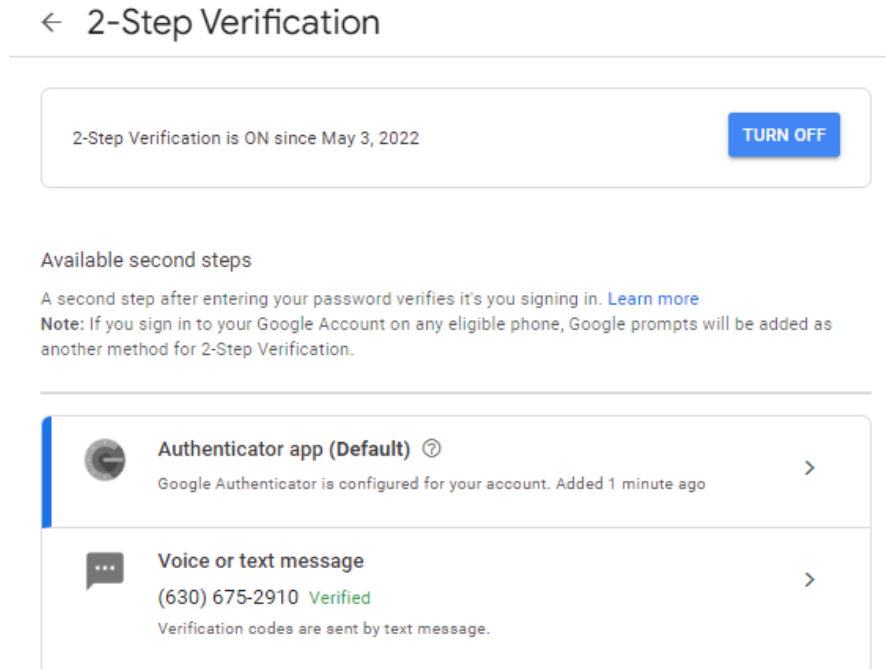

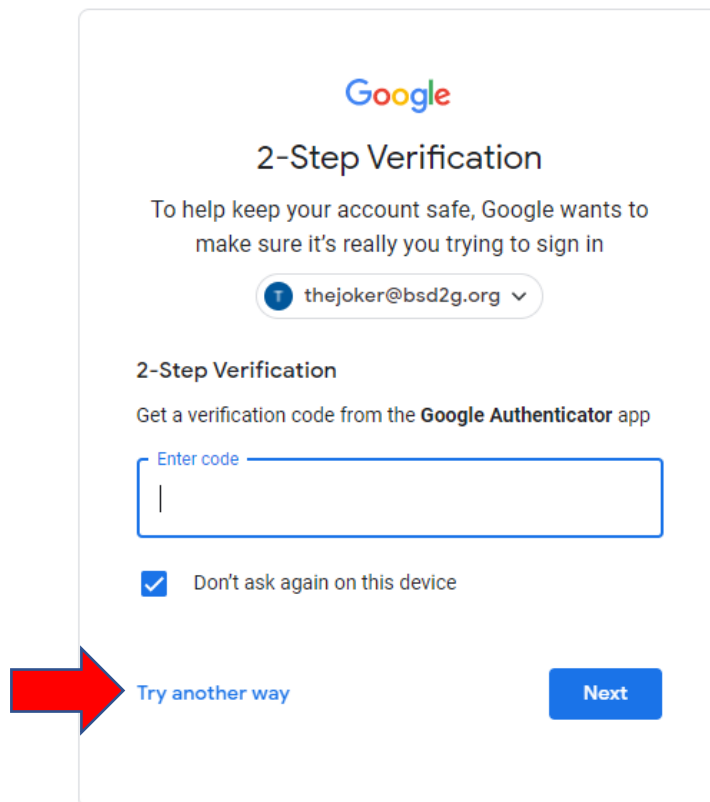


14. Summary screen showing two 2FA methods have been added to your 2FA profile.
